
HARRISBURG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT HANGAR

GREYSTONE PUBLIC HOUSE (HARRISBURG)

Trueax and Stanton Baker of Tanner eciService toured the Greystone Public House Harrisburg, Pennsylvania to examine the repairs needed. Not to be confused with the nearby Greystone Brewhouse, the Greystone Public House is the original sister restaurant. The original stone building was built in 1798 by Godfrey Fritchey, who was one of Harrisburg's earliest settlers. Fritchey was originally born in Schoenlinder, Germany in 1755 and moved to America in 1783. By 1798, Fritchey built the two-story fieldhouse, however, it was not the typical 18th-century home for the Harrisburg area. The majority of houses built in the area at the time were smaller log structures, but Fritchey designed his house to resemble his former home in Bavaria. On April 16, 1805, Godfrey Fritchey obtained a liquor license to operate the Fritchey Tavern.
